Condo Remodel Earns Award of Merit For Waimea-Based Interior Designer

or award-winning interior designer Sue Moss, the most important recognition is one that comes from a happy client.

Recipient of this year's prestigious ASID Hawai'i Award of Merit for her condominium re-design at Mauna Lani Point, Sue recently transformed the previously stark, two-bedroom condo into a warm and inviting residence for homeowners Dan and Pat Nelson.

The couple's '80s-era condo had been renovated by a previous owner who covered every ceiling and wall with white vinyl wallcovering, painted over solid African mahogany doors with white paint and redid the kitchen and master bath in black, teal and white.

"This was definitely not our client's style," said Sue Moss, ASID, LEEDAP, of Trans-Pacific Design in Waimea.

One of her many challenges was to come up with a color palette for the walls, trim and soffits that would bring much-needed warmth to the mostly sterile white interior. The scope of the work included redesigning and reconfiguring the kitchen, bath and master bedroom, installing new lighting, fixtures and plumbing, and working with the Nelsons to select all-new furnishings, finishes, countertops, appliances and accents.

No strangers to Mauna Lani Point, the Nelsons



have stayed in many different units at the resort compound through the years.

"We've been renting units here for over 15 years whenever we'd visit Pat's parent's in Puako," said Dan. "We knew when we bought this unit that we would need a contractor and an interior designer. We are so happy to have found Sue, as well as our contractor, Dan Berg. Sue has been incredible to work with and did an amazing job every step of the way."

With Sue as the homeowner's "eyes and ears on the ground" throughout the process, the contractor gutted the master bathroom and kitchen, and also removed the awkwardly placed slider out from the master bedroom. In the kitchen, the newly expanded space allows for more storage and seating. Quartz countertops complement custom cabinetry by Steve Alterman, of Kailua-Kona, who also crafted the beautiful cherry wood vanity and cabinets in the master bathroom based on Sue's specs.

A color specialist, Sue came up with a combination of Benjamin-Moore paint colors that sets the stage for the fresh, new interiors while also complementing the couple's existing collection of art.

suggested installing tropical panels. It was a look we wanted and it turned out great."
